Innovative Programs to Feed our Keiki!

Keiki Café - 9th Year!

Backpack Programs: Eastside and Ni'ihau Charter Schools

Westside Keiki Café

Serving over 2800 snacks each month to keiki who participate in the Waimea Boys & Girls Club after school activities at the Waimea High School, Waimea Canyon Middle School, Kekaha Neighborhood Center and St. Teresa's of Kekaha. The "Super Snacks" provide nutritious food to keiki between the ages of 7-17. This 52 week program is frequently the only meal that many keiki will have for the remainder of the day.

Lihue Keiki Cafe

Serving over 1800 Super Snacks each week KIFB and the Lihue Boys and Girls Club serve a "Super Snack" during the after school activities for children at Wilcox Elementary School. This 43 week program runs from August to May.





Boys & Girls Club of Hawaii, and specifically the Kauai Branch sites in Kapaa, Lihue and Waimea, have greatly benefited from the many resources of Kauai Independent Food Bank. Our mission is to help youth who need us most, and many boys, girls and their families that we serve simply don't have enough food to feed their families. We see youth every day who have not had a meal until they come to our after-school programs. The food they receive through the Keiki Cafe or Back Pack programs allows them to have some of the daily nutrition they need, which can sustain them through the weekend. We are grateful for this essential partnership. -Keith Cruickshank

Eastside Backpack Program

The Eastside Backpack Program provides keiki healthy and nutritious food each Friday for those keiki who attend the after school activities at the Kapaa Activity Center located on the campus of Kapaa Elementary School and Kapaa High School. Each back pack contains sufficient nutritious and healthy food for a child and his/her siblings for the weekend. This collaborative program with the Kapaa Boys and Girls Club distributes nearly 100 Back Packs each week for 40 weeks from August to May to keiki ages 7-17.

Ni'ihau Backpack Program

In collaboration with Kula Aupuni Ni'ihua A Kahelelani Aloha Public Charter School and the Ke Kula Ni'ihua O Kekaha Learning Center Public Charter School in Kekaha they distribute Backpacks filled with nutritious foods each Friday to approximately 100 keiki for a 43 week program from August to May. The nutritious food in the Backpack is frequently the primary food for the child and his/her siblings over the weekend.





Plant-A-Row/Gleaning

Plant-A-Row was developed to encourage gardeners, growers, schools and farmers to grow just a little extra and donate their fresh, nutritious, and delicious produce to the KIFB. Planting one extra row is an easy, fun way to give back to the community and has been embraced by several schools on Kauai. Making a tangible difference in the lives of your hungry neighbors is as easy as Planting an extra row in your garden! Gleaning means "Gathering the Bounty" from your yard, property, or farm to feed the needy. Getting started can be as easy as helping your neighbor harvest their mangoes! This practice has been used for ages and was the primary means for feeding the hungry throughout history.



E Ku No A Kokua Kupuna

The Senior Program provides senior citizens 60 years and older, the opportunity to acquire fresh fruits, vegetables, bread and dairy products as well as limited amounts of canned goods each Wednesday through Friday from 1-3 P.M. This program is anticipated to serve nearly 150 seniors each month. Home bound seniors can have a "representative shopper" or case worker shop for their needs as well. This program is scheduled to begin the first week of October and will help meet the needs of our elderly with nutritious and healthy food choices.

EBT Farmers' Market Program

The Kauai EBT Program has provided EBT cardholders the opportunity to purchase locally grown fresh vegetables, fruits and other products from Kauai farmers and growers island wide. Beneficiaries of this program are both the farmer and the EBT participant. EBT purchases increases the revenue to the farmer and thus the economy of Kauai. The 2 for 1 program supported by the County of Kauai permits EBT participants to secure twice the value of their purchase with a \$10.00 2 for 1 coupon. Since September 2011, the program includes 128 enrolled vendors, 1,978 EBT participants totaling over \$36,000 dollars in EBT redemptions and over \$38,000 dollars in EBT sales. Tokens/Coupons purchased by participants, at nearly all farmers markets, can be used at any farmers market where a vendor displays their "EBT Tokens accepted here" sign.

"Kauai Independent Food Bank's EBT program at farmer's markets has been a great success and tremendous resource for our community. Because of this program, more people are accessing healthy food, and more money is staying on our island to support local farmers and vendors.
